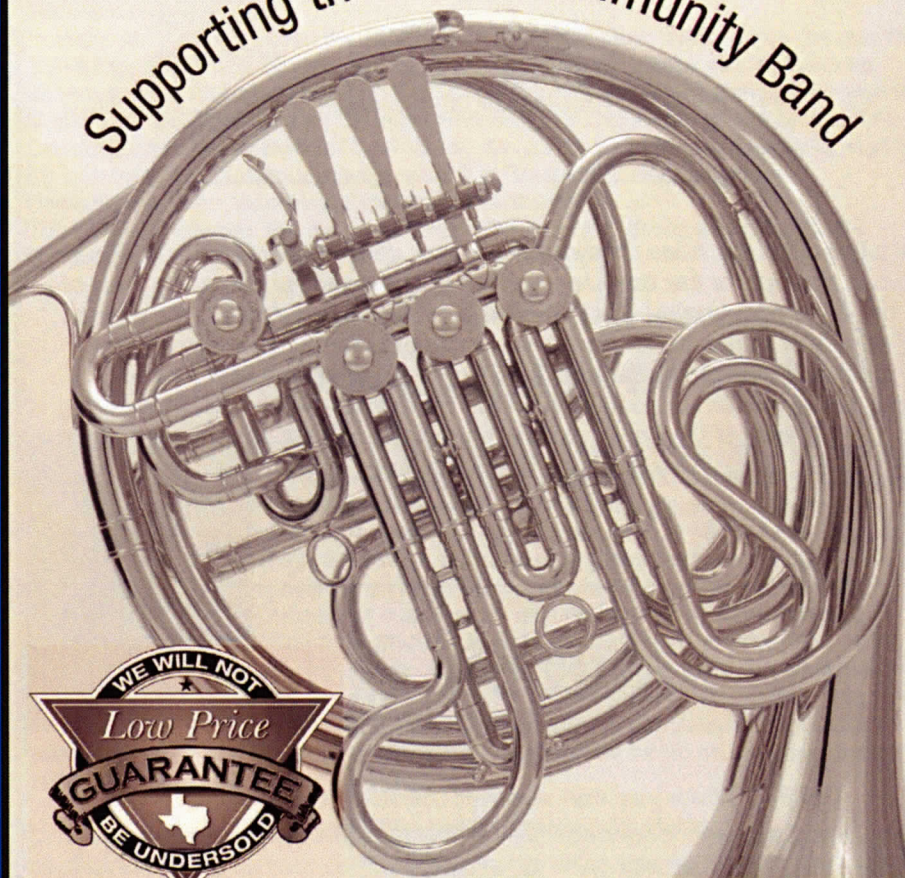

Chris Xeros



Chris Peter Xeros was born September 23, 1927, in Dallas, Texas, of Greek immigrant parents Panagiotis [Peter] and Eleni [Helen]. He graduated from Woodrow Wilson High School, earned his Bachelor of Music and Master of Music Education from the University of North Texas, and also attended Juilliard School of Music and L'Ecole Montreux in Switzerland. Mr. Xeros is a Violinist and Violist, has worked in public schools as Director for Strings/Orchestra Pedagogy, and developed several accessories for string instruments. He is a veteran of the U.S. Army, and served in Korea from 1950-1952.

In 1961, Mr. Xeros founded the Richardson Symphony Orchestra, where he was the Conductor and Music Director for 30 years. In 1990, Mr. Xeros was an honored alumnus of the University of North Texas Music Division for "Outstanding Service to Music". In 1997, he founded the Allen Philharmonic Orchestra, where he was the Conductor and Music Director for 9 years. Mr. Xeros has traveled the world, visiting 59 countries, and has conducted concerts in Scotland, United Kingdom, Netherlands, West Germany, Austria, and Switzerland. The Allen Community Band is very honored to have Mr. Xeros as an Associate Director.

Donald I. Moore



Donald I. Moore was born in Farnhamville, Iowa, on April 11, 1910. He received his B. A. degree from Carleton College in Northfield, Minnesota, in 1932, and his M. A. degree from Colorado State College of Education in 1940. After directing high school bands for several years, including in Dallas at J.L. Long Junior High School where Mr. Chris Xeros was a student at the time, he was named Director of Bands at Colorado State College of Education in January 1941. After service in the U. S. Navy from 1942 to 1945, he completed an Ed. D. degree at the University of Michigan, and went to New York City for a year as director of bands at both the Juilliard School of Music and Columbia University. In September 1948, he became Director of Bands at Baylor University in Waco.

Dr. Moore was Professor of Music and is Director Emeritus of Bands at Baylor where he directed the bands from 1948 to 1969, during which time he became nationally recognized as a composer, conductor, clinician and adjudicator of bands throughout the United States. During Dr. Moore's direction, the Baylor Golden Wave Band became nationally famous, particularly in introducing new band music, some of which he wrote. Best known of these are "Marcho Poco", "Ides of March", "Dawn of Peace", "March Forth" and "Rise and Shine".

Dr. Moore was inducted into the Texas Bandmasters Hall of Fame in 1993.

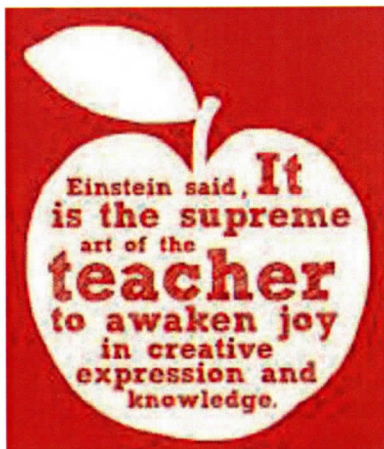
Cast of Bronze Handbell Ensemble Concert

Program Notes

The Star-Spangled Banner – Written by Francis Scott Key, an attorney and gifted amateur poet, while watching the British bombard Fort McHenry in Baltimore Harbor during the War of 1812. This is the first concert-sized publication of the superb Sousa-Damrosch “The Star-Spangled Banner”, and remains one of the most standard and sing-able arrangements of the United States National Anthem. It was harmonized in 1917 by Walter Damrosch and skillfully arranged by John Philip Sousa.

23 Skidoo! – The term “skidoo” began as an American slang term before World War I meaning “get out of here quick!” This challenging, yet fun piece is arranged in a Roaring 20’s style by American composer Kenneth George Whitcomb. Whitcomb was a clarinetist, saxophonist and arranger in the United States Military Academy Band at West Point. Later he became the second conductor of this elite military orchestra. Subsequently, he was transferred to Germany and became the conductor of the 30th United States Army Band. After he left the military, he returned to California and first became a saxophonist in an orchestra at Disneyland in Anaheim, California. Then, he was asked by Walt Disney to compose/arrange marches and festive music, which would be played in every Disney amusement park in the whole world. He retired in 1973 and has since been a freelance composer in the Los Angeles area.

Eagles on Tour – The Eagles, a Los Angeles-based American rock band, boast seven number-one singles, six Grammys, five American Music Awards, six number one albums, and were one of the most successful musical acts of the 1970s. This arrangement features three of their biggest and most beloved hits, including the bluesy “Heartache Tonight”, the beautiful “Desperado”, and the mysteriously haunting “Hotel California”. Classic rock that will never grow old!

Pepita Greus – “Pepita Greus” is a pasodoble composed by Pascual Perez Chovi. The original dedication by Chovi was “To the inspired poetess Lady Angela-Josefa Greus Saez.” Pepita is a nickname for Josefa (meaning “little Josefa” or Josephine) which was her childhood name. At the age of seven, Chovi began studying clarinet with the director of the municipal band in the nearby city of Valencia. By the time he was eleven, the talented young musician was the E-flat clarinet soloist and later the principal B-flat clarinetist in that band. Perez Chovi became conductor of the Municipal Band of Alginet. The band later won first prize at the competition in Valencia. “Pepita Greus” is the best known of his works.

Program Notes

Disneyland Celebration – What could be better than a flashy medley featuring some of the great musical moments associated with this American icon of family entertainment? This fast-paced and terrific-sounding arrangement includes: “Fantasmic!”, “Mickey Mouse March”, “Zip-A-Dee-Doo-Dah”, “It’s a Small World”, “Part of Your World”, and “Be Our Guest”.

Marcho Poco – Written in the late 1930’s, “Marcho Poco” is one of Dr. Moore’s more popular compositions. It was a bit ahead of its time in some of its scoring and combination of instruments as it incorporates various melodic lines spread throughout the Band, often in sections where those lines do not typically appear. All of which lead to a very enjoyable selection to both hear and perform. Mr. Xeros was a student at J.L. Long Junior High in Dallas and recalled the band playing the march and what a good piece it was. As the piece has long been out of print, the hunt began to find a copy and led to the Band Department at Baylor University where Dr. Moore spent over 20 years as Director of the Golden Wave Band. “Marcho Poco” was located in the band archives and Baylor gladly shared a copy of the parts. Unfortunately, there was no score with the parts. As the score is the Conductor’s map to manage all the various parts, another challenge presented itself. A call went out to the Band, and Mike Rightmire, our Bari Sax player, volunteered to set up the score. And off we went. A copy of “Marcho Poco” will remain in the library of the Allen Community Band, as well as in the private collection of Mr. Xeros. A copy of the newly printed score will be provided to the Baylor University Band.

John Williams: Movie Adventures – In a career spanning over six decades, John Williams has composed some of the most popular and recognizable film scores in cinematic history. Williams has won five Academy Awards, four Golden Globe Awards, and 22 Grammy Awards. With 50 Academy Award nominations, Williams is the second most nominated individual, after Walt Disney. In 2016, he received the AFI Life Achievement Award.

This piece is an outstanding medley that captures the excitement of some of John Williams’ biggest movie hits. Arranger Michael Sweeney includes: “Star Wars Main Theme”, “Duel of the Fates” (from The Phantom Menace); “Theme from Jurassic Park”; and “Theme from E.T. The Extra-Terrestrial”.

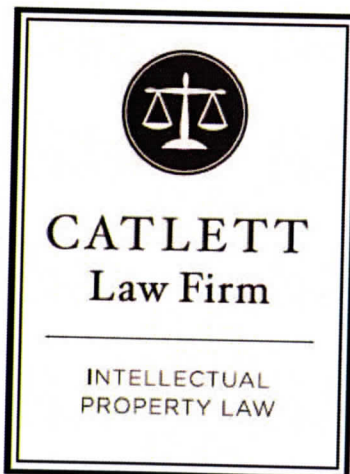
